WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 17 – 23 March, 2008

DANGEROUS GOODS

On 18 Mar 08, 21 homes (approximately 50 people) were evacuated and 200 homes were without power in the Maple Ridge area when a Terasen natural gas line was hit and punctured by an excavator at approximately 11:30. Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO) raised the incident to Code 2 (urgent status) as a result of the evacuation and potential for explosion. Maple Ridge activated their Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) to level one. Evacuees were allowed to return when gas and power were restored to residential properties and plans were in place to relight commercial and industrial customers. The Southwest Provincial Emergency Operations Centre (PREOC), Maple Ridge EOC, Emergency Program Coordinator, Emergency Social Services, BC Hydro, Oil and Gas Commission, Terasen Gas, MOE, Environment Canada, Office of the Fire Commissioner and PEP Management were advised and monitored the situation.
